



Collaboration

An IHF Research Fellow typically spends one year in Minneapolis. Each Fellow develops a specific research project in collaboration with Dr. Paparella and other accomplished scientists. Projects in clinical or basic science are developed to enhance Fellows' knowledge, allow them to gain a broader perspective in the field of otolaryngology, and enable them to return to their homelands with information that will benefit people in their countries. Projects will be prepared for presentations at conferences and for publication in journals or textbooks.



Duration of Visiting Fellowships for those who may or may not participate in research vary from weeks to years as determined by the individual's specific goals set in collaboration with Dr. Paparella.

Candidacy

Fellows are expected to have knowledge specific to the field of otolaryngology either through research or training in otolaryngology (currently in or completed). Fellows routinely fund their experience through private or government sponsorships. If Fellowships exceed more than six months, J-1 Visas are normally obtained. For Research Fellows, use of the English language is helpful to ensure a fruitful experience. For Visiting Fellows, proficiency in the English language is not required.
